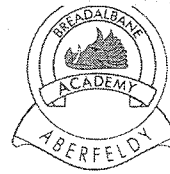

Community Day 25th June

On Thursday the 25th June Breadalbane Academy will be undertaking its first whole school community day. This is a day of action when pupils and staff will go out into their communities and 'put something back'.

As we have over 400 pupils in the secondary school it has been decided that pupils should stay in their local area in order to help their own communities.

Pupils who get the bus from Pitlochry will stay in Pitlochry and register at 9am at the bottom of East Moulin road. There will also be an afternoon register at 2pm, again, at the Scout hall.

Pupils who get the buses from Dunkeld will be based in Dunkeld for the day. They should register at the recreation ground by the tennis courts at 9am in the morning and afternoon registration will also take place there at 2pm.

Pupils local to Rannoch will need to register at Rannoch primary school in the morning with Mr Clarke and Mr Hamilton at 9am.

Everyone else will be expected to register in Breadalbane academy in the 4 court hall. Again, there will be an afternoon register taken at 2pm.

The jobs that will be undertaken during the day are many and varied. There will be litter picks, garden tidies, planting and weeding, conservation work and much more. Pupils should wear old clothes and come dressed suitably for the weather. A pair of gardening gloves would also be a benefit.

All of the jobs we are doing have been identified by people within the respective communities. In some cases we will be helping out people who would benefit from extra help. Everything we will be undertaking will have a positive impact on the community and allow pupils the chance to understand their role in it. This is a chance to take citizenship education out of the classroom and for staff and pupils to work together in very different circumstances.
