**Scottish Crannog Centre Thursday 31<sup>st</sup> May 2018**

S2 Historians have the opportunity to run a pop-up café at the Scottish Crannog Centre on Thursday 31<sup>st</sup> May 2018 as part of the History Departments contribution to Developing the Young Workforce. Pupils will be making biscuits, scones and soup in school during that week using evidence of ingredients used in the Iron Age discovered through archaeological research of the crannog sites on Loch Tay and elsewhere. The Crannog staff have asked for approximately 15 pupils to be on site to help sell the food to visitors and to help with some activities. You will remember that all of S1 visited the Crannog in S1.

Transport to and from the site will be by school mini bus. Pupils will be back in time for the school buses at 3.40pm. The food will be cooked at school and taken down to the site where pupils will serve it to visitors. Pupils will also be asked to help with any washing up and tidying up – just as in a commercial café. Pupils should dress in warm clothes and wear comfortable footwear suitable for rough ground on the loch side. A waterproof jacket is essential. Pupils will need a packed lunch and a drink. There is no cost involved for pupils.

Your son/daughter has expressed a desire to help run the pop-up café on the 31<sup>st</sup> May. If you are in agreement, please fill in the consent form and return it to me by Wednesday 23<sup>rd</sup> May at the latest.
