When we have an object, we call it the whole, as it is one complete object. |  |  | then we say it is in 2 halves. When we split the whole into 4 equal parts, we call each part a quarter. Have a look at the video to find out more. This means getting some objects and seeing if you can share them fairly between different people. If you're sharing a number between 4 people, or into 4 different group, then you will be splitting them into quarters. If you are sharing then into 2 groups, you will be splitting them in halves and so on. Have a look at the video to remind yourself about sharing fairly. Then, I would like you to try and solve some problems! Can you find out what is a quarter of 24 ? (Remember, you'll need to share it into 4 groups.) How about half of 20 ? (Remember, you'll need to share it into 2 groups.) What other fractions of amounts can you find? Let me know how you get on. Today we're going <br> to start looking at sharing numbers into equal <br> groups. A good example of this is shown in the <br> picture. Someone had 6 cookies and they shared <br> them equally between 2 friends. They took one <br> cookie at a time, gave one to one friend, then one <br> to the other friend and repeated this until all of the <br> cookies were used up. In this way, they have made <br> sure that each friend has the same amount of <br> cookies, they have seem shared equally. Your job <br> today is to practise sharing things equally.
