Using Adverbs

Adverbs are used to describe verbs. They tell us **how** something was done.

e.g. Alanna ran **quickly** down the street.

Quickly is the **adverb**. It tells us **how** Alanna ran.

Adverbs often end in the letters 'ly' – but not always.

quickly	slowly	usually	happily	painfully	nervously
sadly	truthfully	often	rarely	beautifully	carelessly
