

<p><b>Literacy- This term the class will:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Take notes from what they read, listen to or watch and use their notes to create new texts.</li> <li>➤ Uplevel sentences to include better vocabulary, openers, punctuation and connectives.</li> <li>➤ Gather information using Table of Contents, Index, Glossary and captions.</li> <li>➤ Set targets in writing – and strive to meet them.</li> <li>➤ Check written work against success criteria.</li> <li>➤ Prepare and give a presentation on a famous French or Scottish person.</li> <li>➤ Learn number facts to 20 and Christmas words and phrases in French.</li> </ul>	<p><b>Numeracy- This term the class will:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Learn or consolidate multiplication and division stories.</li> <li>➤ Learn to multiply beyond the tables.</li> <li>➤ Identify and extend a number or shape pattern.</li> <li>➤ Recognise square, triangular and Fibonacci numbers.</li> <li>➤ Recognise and begin to use percentages and make links between fractions, decimals and percentages.</li> <li>➤ Complete more sophisticated symmetrical shapes and create their own.</li> <li>➤ Learn to name and describe by their properties a range of 2D and 3D shapes.</li> <li>➤ Classify and draw angles accurately, estimate and measure degrees.</li> </ul>
