Learning Intention

Sky Room, P1 – 3:

I can create an Earth Day poster of Planet Earth using paper, card, and other resources.

P4 – 7:

I can create an Earth Day poster of Planet Earth using imaginative and creative ideas and a range of media and resources.

I can add text and/or other images to my poster, describing how I will “make a difference”.

Resources

Use what you have and adapt the task if you wish.

Images of Planet Earth, glue stick or make your own glue (see the recipe below – lots of recipes on YouTube!)

paper or card (use old magazines or newspapers, wrapping paper, old wallpaper, recycled packaginganything you can find!)

Tip: Cereal box would make a good poster if you use the inside!

Remember to check with an adult that magazines/junk etc. are finished with.

Activity

Create an Earth Day Collage Poster – any size, large or small.

1. **Discuss:** Have a chat with friends/family and share your design ideas and think about the resources you might use.
2. **Think:** Decide now how you will use your resources and how big your Earth will be.
3. **Plan:** - Check out the picture example (below) and YouTube Lesson – feel free to adapt this if needed

Tip - Remember you can pause the video lesson whenever you need to or re-watch as many times as you like.

Sketch out your plan in pencil on scrap paper or card – share with a friend/family member asking questions – What’s good about my design? – What do you like? – What could I improve? Make your design improvements and note down the resources you will need.

4. **Prepare:** Find a place to work (check with an adult), cover tables with paper or an old sheet/tablecloth to keep things clean! Collect, pencil, pens, glue, paper, card, magazines, newspapers, scissors (make sure they are safe),

5. **Create....**Use your ideas and the YouTube Lesson, adapt the ideas of others and have fun!!!

6. **Share:** Take a picture of your work and share and send to friends, keep your pictures so you can share with your teacher and others. Display your poster at home to inspire yourself and your family.

Further activities you may wish to do	<p>i) Your poster: You may want to add “Earth Day 22nd April 2020”, “a catchy slogan – reduce, reuse, re-cycle” etc. or choose to make a “pledge” e.g. “I will recycle more”. Discuss with your family how you are going to keep your pledge...every day!</p> <p>ii) If you can, make a short video clip of your poster:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Describe how you made it, what is best and what was tricky• Explain your pledge to help Planet Earth• Share your work and ideas with your family, friends and teachers
Glue Recipe	<p>There are lots of different ways to make homemade glue. The simplest glue is made from a paste of flour and water. You can also make cornflour (corn-starch) or milk glue. All are quick, easy, non-toxic, and great for making paper crafts including paper-mâché projects and are good for making with children.</p> <p>Basic Glue (be careful not to waste flour as this is in short supply)</p> <p>Ingredients</p> <p>1 cup of flour ½ a cup of water 1/8 teaspoon of salt</p> <p>Method: Mix your flour and water in a bowl with a spoon. Blend the mixture until it is as thick as pancake batter. The paste should not be too thick or too drippy.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• If you need more glue, simply double the recipe.• If you need less glue, start with the amount of flour you will use, then add water, a teaspoon at a time, until it reaches the right consistency. <p>Note: This glue will not last too long, so make and use right away.</p>
