

<p>Literacy: During term 1, we will continue to revise our phonic sounds, as well as developing our writing, reading, listening and talking skills. Most children will be able to:</p> <p>Reading</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • use their knowledge of phonics to improve their fluency • identify the purpose of a text, and answer questions about it <p>Writing</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Improve the accuracy of their spelling • Self-check to make sure their writing makes sense • Present their writing in a legible and forming letters correctly <p>Listening and talking</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • understand when to talk and listen, and when to ask questions 	<p>Numeracy: During term 1 we will revisit learning, as well as consolidating new learning to make sure most children can:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • add and subtract within 10, or 20 for some • estimate the position of numbers on a number line to 10 (or beyond) • estimate and reliably count up to 50, and verbalise ‘one more’ and ‘one less’ • verbalise the days of the week, and say which day is after or before any other day • tell the time by reading whole hour times on a clock face.
<p>Health & Wellbeing: During term 1, our class PE slots are on a Monday and daily kilometre every morning.</p> <p>In PE, all children will work towards being able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • move safely around the space, being aware of their own body • understand how to improve their personal fitness, and what ‘being fit’ means • work with others to play co-operative games. <p>During circle time, we will be discussing:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • how to be a good friend, and how to build positive relationships • recognising our own feelings, and the feelings of others, and be able to talk about them and ask for help if required 	<p>Contexts for Learning: This term, our topic will be a literacy study of ‘The Rainbow Fish’, and other sea related activities. These topics were chosen by the class. All children will have opportunities to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • use a variety of methods to show what they have learned in different ways, for example, art and story writing. • use their imagination to write alternate endings to stories, and write their own stories using a stimulus. (Sponge Bob characters) • learn the importance of friendships and sharing. (The Rainbow Fish) • create their own classroom display
