What you need	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Puppets – hand puppets, paper puppets, soft toys etc 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Nothing 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Different sized balls (e.g. golf ball, tennis ball, football, rugby ball) or objects to throw safely (bean bag, frisbee)
Activity	<p>Create and perform a puppet show for your family. Why not try some different funny voices! Make sure you speak loudly and clearly so everyone can hear your show.</p>	<p>Go outside for a scavenger hunt! Can you find:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 6 sticks 2 feathers 5 stones 3 green things 4 different leaves 	<p>In a safe space, practice throwing and catching with the different objects/balls you have chosen. Focus on under-arm throwing, and catching with 2 hands.</p>
Extension	<p>Try to act out a simple known story using puppets, e.g. the 3 little pigs, getting the parts of the story in the correct order</p>	<p>Arrange each category in order, e.g. longest to shortest stick, heaviest to lightest stone, biggest to smallest leaf.</p>	<p>Try standing a little further away from each other. Can you throw and catch while standing on one leg?</p>
Skills	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Taking turns, understanding when to talk and when to listen Imagination and creativity Empathy – sharing the feelings of the characters 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Counting and 1:1 correspondence Observation skills Sorting and comparing objects 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Hand-eye coordination Gross motor skills – developing control Developing throwing accuracy

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
	Dance	Developing the Young Workforce	Story
What you need	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> A piece of music you like 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Nothing 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> An internet-enabled device to watch a video
Activity	<p>Make up a dance to the music, thinking about using all the different parts of your body. It would be great if you could film yourself and upload it to SeeSaw!</p>	<p>What do you want to do when you grow up? Draw a picture of you as a grown-up. Will you wear a uniform? Will you work outside or inside?</p>	<p>Listen to the story of Harry and the Bucketful of Dinosaurs (Listen to Mrs Hunter read as part of the school assembly this week)</p>
Extension	<p>Think about the tempo (speed) and rhythm of the music, and how it influenced the choice and speed of movements in your dance.</p>	<p>Think about what skills you might need to do the job you want to do. Will you need to work with computers, or tools? Work as part of a team? Do you know anyone who does the job you want to do?</p>	<p>Once you have listened to the story, have a go at carefully making a path between the dinosaurs and the buckets on the pencil control sheets. Colour them in carefully when you have finished.</p>
