

<p>Literacy: Learners will –</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Revise French topics and learn simple sentence speaking and writing skills. • Improve accuracy and fluency of reading, focussing on inference and understanding of text. • Focus on creation of texts, including instructional texts and reports. • Practise skills with Vocabulary, Connectives and Punctuation. • Practise listening with respect and talking assertively. 	<p>Numeracy: Learners will –</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identify and find fractions of shapes and quantities, e.g $\frac{1}{4}$ of 20, $\frac{2}{9}$ of 27. • Recognise and be able to find equivalent fractions. • Find a percentage of a quantity. • Organise and interpret data from tables, line graphs and bar charts • Work out which calculation is needed in a word problem and use a range of methods to work out a solution.
<p>Health & Wellbeing: Learners will –</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Develop skills in athletics; running, jumping and throwing. • Practise tennis skills and learn to play and score a straightforward game. • Learn about puberty, relationships and parenthood and be able to name a greater range of body parts. • Learn the names of more emotions and be able to describe and discuss them. • Learn to control emotions and manage conflict. 	<p>Contexts for Learning: Learners will –</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Investigate the culture, geography, farming, industries etc of a chosen country and present to the class. • Discover, explore, conserve and share Nature’s Wood for the John Muir Discovery Award. • Investigate Inheritance and the Lifecycles of plants and animals.
