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Dear Parent/Carer

Maths Staffing - Session 23/24

I am writing again to update you on the challenges we have been facing in our Maths department this session.

Staffing

Our Principal Teacher of Maths Mr Kevin Hodgson remains absent and our recent recruitment process to replace Mr Keith Ritchie was ultimately unsuccessful due to the late withdrawal of a candidate to whom we had offered a position.

I am pleased to inform you, however, that Pitlochry High School have agreed to provide us with a further half day of input from Acting-Principal Teacher Mrs Fiona Fennell, as well as to allowing Mr John Wrightson, Principal Teacher of Maths at Pitlochry, to come to Breadalbane for two days a week to support us with the teaching of our National 5 Applications of Maths class. This latter staffing addition means that all Maths classes will now be taught by an appropriately qualified teacher. This will continue to be the case when Mrs Lumsden leaves us temporarily for maternity leave at the end of this week. We are of course hugely grateful to Pitlochry High School for supporting us in this way.

We will attempt again over the coming weeks to recruit to vacant posts. However, should these processes fail to be fruitful, we are confident that our existing contingency arrangements can run at least until the change of timetable in May, and so provide continuity up to and beyond the SQA examination leave.

Attainment

On the subject of SQA examinations, I did inform you in my last letter that we would be looking closely at prelim results to measure the progress of classes this year against those of previous cohorts. Having now conducted such an analysis, I am pleased to say that all class performances are generally positive for this year's cohort, based on predicted attainment post-prelim. The following tables provide a detailed comparison between performances in *Higher Maths* and *National 5* last session and this session.

We cannot share this information in grid format as small numbers could make individuals identifiable.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all staff involved in supporting the Maths department so far this session in keeping our young people on track.
